## What is Title I?

Title I is a federal program that provides supplemental funding to local school districts to help ensure that all children, particularly the most academically at-risk students, meet the state's high academic standards



## **Title I Part A program overview**

Title I programs are based on effective means of improving student academic achievement and include strategies to support parent and family engagement. Funds can be allocated to additional staff, instructional supplies and equipment, technology, and extended student learning opportunities.

YHALE Academy is a schoolwide Title I program. This means all students regardless of economically at-risk within the school can benefit from Title I services.



## **1% set-aside for parent and family engagement**

YHALE does not currently receive Title I allocation greater than \$500,000. We are not required to set aside an allocation for parent and family engagement.
